- 129 plots of varying size suitable for everyone from groups to individuals
- Raised beds offering better drainage and soil control
- Gardening tools provided in a permanent storage shed – every tool you need to plant, tend and harvest your garden. We want to make it easy for anyone to garden.
- Fenced Perimeter offering security and peace of mind
- Water and hose access throughout the garden


